Notice to MNAid Users

Social Security Number Use:

Section 7(b) of the Federal Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. 552a) requires that when any federal, state, or local government agency asks you to disclose your Social Security Account number, you must be advised whether that disclosure is mandatory or voluntary, by what statutory or other authority the number is solicited, and what uses will be made of it. The Social Security number will be used by the Minnesota Office of Higher Education to verify your identity, and as an identifier of your file in order to record necessary data accurately. As an identifier, the Social Security number is used in the administration of State Financial Aid for such purposes as processing applications, program evaluation, and reporting. You are being advised that disclosure of your Social Security number is voluntary. However, failure to submit your Social Security number may prevent further processing of state financial aid applications.
